What is Smudging?

Smudging is a spiritual and cultural practice observed by many Indigenous Peoples (First Nations & Métis predominantly) that involves the burning of one or more sacred medicines including, but not limited to, tobacco, sweet grass, sage and/or cedar. The smoke is used to cleanse a room, person or group.
